In-person services and results are given on the spot in as little as 30 minutes, with busier days having an estimated turnaround time of 1-2 hours

LifeGuard App	An App activated by the user before they take their dose. After 50 seconds the App will sound an alarm. If the user doesn't hit a button to stop the alarm, indicating they are fine, the alarm grows louder. After 75 seconds a text-to-voice call will go straight to 9-1-1, alerting emergency medical dispatchers of a potential overdose
